All of LIAAC's programs are geared to meet the needs of Long Island's diverse racial and ethnic populations with 3,878 unduplicated clients served per year.

CLIENT RISK FACTORS

- Injections Drug Use/Drug-Related 8.2%
- MSM (Men Having Sex with Men) 6.3%
- MSM/IDU 0.6%
- High Risk Heterosexual Contact 74.5%
- Undetermined Risk Factors 10.4%

Included in this client profile: Women 39.2%, Men 56.9%, Unknown 3.9%, Black 41.1%, White 32.2%, Native American .7%, Asian Pacific Islander 2.8%, Unknown 23.2%; Hispanic 24.4%, Non-Hispanic 71.8%, Unknown 3.8%.
